And the best thing ... I proved the medical advice wrong! I have since achieved an electrical trade qualification, Master's Degree in Education and Career Development, Master's Degree in Educational Neuroscience, and Bachelor of Education in Adult Vocational and Workplace Training. As well as being a full time Teacher for TAFE NSW, I regularly present motivational talks to groups of young people - as the kid who was told he would never achieve anything, much less be in the public eye.
